



Greater Nashville Realtors Opposes July Referendum

(Nashville) – In [a post to its website](#), Greater Nashville Realtors underscored its opposition to the July referendum, outlining how, if passed, it would “result in deep cuts to critical services we all depend on, as well as stopping progress in Nashville.”

*“It would cause drastic funding cuts to first responders and critical services like firefighters,” the post explains. “Threaten the safety and security of Nashville residents. **Limit funding for education** (schools and teachers), and **cut funding to other public services** such as trash pickup, park and library operations and/or Metro administrative offices **such as Codes and Permits**. It would also **eliminate investment in new affordable housing** and transit initiatives. It will also hamper the city’s efforts to fully recover from the economic impact of COVID-19.”*

The organization, a member of the Save Nashville Now coalition, issued this statement as part of efforts to educate Nashvillians about the consequences of the referendum.
