



Metro Nashville School Board Chairwoman Warns of Threat Posed by Reckless July Referendum

Parents, Students, Residents at Risk

(NASHVILLE) – Metro Nashville School Board Chairwoman Christiane Buggs today joined a growing coalition of Nashville community leaders speaking out against the dangerous referendum being pursued by a group of radical extremists. She warned of the impact of this referendum on the city’s education system.

“As a long-time educator and advocate, proud parent, and product of our Nashville school system, I know first-hand the real harm this reckless referendum poses to our schools, teachers and students,” said Christiane Buggs, chairwoman of the Metro Nashville School Board. “It’s simple. Less investment means bigger classes, fewer activities, lower teacher pay and school repairs unfinished. We cannot afford to let this happen. We must join together and protect our children and future generations by defeating this proposal.”

Christiane Buggs is a Nashville native and former MNPS student who went on to earn a bachelor’s degree in physics and two master’s degrees in Education before returning to MNPS as a middle school math teacher.
